



## “Gossip is a plague worse than COVID”

Gossiping sows division, Pope Francis told people gathered in St. Peter’s Square for the midday recitation of the Angelus prayer on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> September.

Commenting on the Gospel reading on Sunday (*about Jesus telling his disciples what to do when a member of the community errs and requires correction*), Pope Francis said that rather than helping the other to mend their ways, “when we see a mistake, a fault, a slip, in that brother or sister, usually the first thing we do is to go and recount it to others — to gossip.”

“The great gossip is the Devil, who always goes around recounting bad things about others, because he is the liar who seeks to divide the church, to distance brothers and sisters and not create community,” the pope said.

“Please, brothers and sisters, let us make an effort not to gossip,” he said. “Let’s try: no gossip!”

The goal, the pope said, is not to embarrass or punish, but to rehabilitate.
